- History** ■ The Na Karmeli educational centre, where Škoda Auto University and the employees of the education department have their facilities, is in the centre of Mladá Boleslav. It comprises several historical buildings (a church, a former monastery and a convent) that were modernised as listed buildings and are situated next to the site where the new university buildings were erected.

Škoda Auto University was founded in 2000 and to date it is the first and the only company-owned university in the Czech Republic. Škoda Auto University is a private tertiary-level school with a trade-specific academic baccalaureate programme and a follow-up master degree programme.

The baccalaureate programme provides students with curricula in three specializations, Business Management and Administration, Business Management and Sales, and Business Administration and Finance in both full time and distance learning programs. The graduates from this academic programme earn a Bachelor Degree, and the entitlement to write „Bc.“ before their name.

The graduate academic programme (a follow-up master's degree programme) provides students with curricula in four specializations, Corporate Finance Management in the Global Environment, Marketing Management in the Global Environment, Production Management and Global Business, and Global Business and Law. The graduates from this academic programme earn a Master Degree, and the entitlement to write „Ing.“ before their name.

Škoda Auto University has been developing its international relations since the very beginning. At present the Centre for International Academic Mobility cooperates with

colleges and universities as well as companies within the European Union and other parts of the world. From 2005 to 2006 the school was awarded the Erasmus University Charter (EUC) and successfully participated in the Leonardo da Vinci program. In 2007, after the changes in the structure of the EU programmes, the school was repeatedly awarded the extended EUC, which entitles the university to apply for EU grants supporting long-term students' mobility (studies and practical training) and also the lecturers to tutor abroad. Our students and members of the academic staff also participate in other projects and educational activities abroad outside of the Erasmus programme, and invite partners to different events at the university.

Škoda Auto company intends to use the Na Karmeli centre in addition to Škoda Auto University and the Coaching program for closer cooperation with technical universities in the preparation of new study programmes and projects aimed at Škoda Auto. The St. Bonaventura Church is also located on the premises of the Na Karmeli centre and has all the prerequisites to become the perfect place for graduation ceremonies, matriculations and various corporate, cultural and social events. These can successfully enrich the cultural life of both the local community and the Mladá Boleslav region.

Organisation of Studies

- The timetable specifies the study period before examinations, the examination period, the internship period, and school breaks and vacations in each academic year.

Academic Year: September 1 – August 31

Winter Semester: 14 weeks (last semester of studies 10 weeks), the winter semester usually begins during the 1st week of October.

Winter Examination Period: 5 weeks

Summer Semester: 14 weeks

Summer Examination Period: 5 weeks

Summer Vacation: July – August

Registration Period: September. The registration period is reserved for verification of academic requirements, registration for the given academic year, and – if required in exceptional circumstances - remedial exams

Required Internship: 5th semester of studies

Duration of study

baccalaureate programme: 3,5 years (7 semesters)

follow-up master's degree programme: 2 years (4 semesters)

Forms of Study

Full time

The studies are run in accordance with the curricula and the organization of the academic year. The focus is on the direct education process as well as in the individual

approach of students and their work with literature and other information sources.

Distance learning

This form of study is mainly designed for applicants who have full-time employment. It is organized in such a way that the students are able to manage both, their jobs and study duties.
