- History**
- Karel Engliš College is a joint stock company, which received state permission to operate as a private higher education institution on 25 June 2001. The college draws its inspiration from the tradition based on the name of the famous Czech economist and lawyer Prof. Karel Engliš. In the time between the first and second world wars, Karel Engliš was the first rector of Masaryk University, several times the finance minister of the former Czechoslovak Republic, and governor of the Czech National Bank.

- Structure of the Institution**
- **Karel Engliš College consists of 4 departments:**
    - Department of Economics
    - Department of Management (including section of languages)
    - Department of Law
    - Department of Information Technologies

The College has three branches, in Brno, Liberec and Prague

- Organisation of Studies**
- The academic year is divided into two semesters (winter and summer semester), each of which lasts 13 teaching weeks. Each semester is followed by a four to five week examination period. The College offers a Bachelor's degree programme and after the state final examination awards the degree "bakalář" (i.e. "Bachelor"), abbreviated as "Bc."

The graduates are trained for positions in middle and higher management positions in both commercial and non-profit institutions.
